- Annual fall conference scheduled for September 10 and will be in-person at UNM. Planning for mask requirement during workshops. Conference program: each workshop is 3 contact hours; The Importance of Physical Therapy During the Fourth Trimester; The 2022 Physical Therapist Management of Parkinson Disease: A Clinical Practice Guideline from the American Physical Therapy Association: Translation Into the Clinic; Clinical Assessment and Recommendation for Pediatric Orthotic Intervention; Inspired Breathing – An Evidence-Based Approach to Improve Respiration
